Killara Station Upgrade

Community notification – February 2023

Transport for NSW is upgrading Killara Station as part of the Transport Access Program (TAP) to make it easier for everyone to access, including people with a disability or limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

Work is progressing well at the station. In December and January, we continued internal upgrades to the platform building and installed the structural steel lift shafts and bridge deck. We also carried out work to install new disability compliant footpaths on Culworth Avenue, including new kerbs, gutters, and concrete pavement.

Upcoming work in February

Construction work will continue throughout February and includes:

- ongoing work on the station building and toilets
- further work on the new accessible footpath on Culworth Avenue
- accessible footpath upgrades on Werona Avenue
- installation of screens for the new bridge
- piling works for the deflection walls
- trenching to install stormwater and utilities services
- cable hauling to power the new lifts
- delivery of materials for the new lifts.

Equipment used for this work includes excavators, concrete and delivery trucks and powered hand tools. Some of this work was planned to occur last year, however due to unforeseen impacts, such as wet weather and site conditions, these activities will be carried out in February.

Werona Avenue work

Last year, we notified the community that as a result of further design refinement, the existing footpath on Werona Avenue will be retained and modified to ensure it meets the accessibility requirements for the project.

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Additional scope has been added to Werona Avenue, including the installation of a new bench seat and bin enclosure at the bus stop, and new bus stop stairs to be built in the existing location.

Night work in February

From 6pm Friday 3 February to 1am Monday 6 February and from 6pm Friday 10 February to 1am Monday 13 February, work is planned at Killara Station during a scheduled shutdown, when the station is closed, and trains will not be running.

Work will be carried out at night to minimise the impacts on vehicle and pedestrian movements and ensure the safety of our workers and the public. Directly impacted residents will be individually contacted in advance of the work.

During this time, Werona Avenue will be closed, and detours will be in place.

Temporary bus stop relocation

During the weekend works between **Friday 3 February** to **Monday 6 February** and **Friday 10 February** to **Monday 13 February**, the bus stop on Culworth Avenue will also be relocated to Lorne Avenue, approximately 120 metres from the existing bus stop.

Bus replacement services will be in place as the station will be closed and trains will not be running.

Station footbridge temporarily closed

To ensure the safety of our workers and customers, the footbridge at the station will be closed from 10pm Friday 3 February to 2am Monday 6 February and from 10pm Friday 10 February to 2am Monday 13 February while we carry out this work. Alternate pedestrian routes to the bus stop on Lorne Avenue and Culworth Avenue can be found at Stanhope and Powell streets.

Signage will be in place to direct pedestrians to alternate routes while the work is completed. Please follow the directions on these signs and follow the instructions of traffic control crews.

Northcote avenue access point

The Sydney Trains access point at Northcote Avenue is used by our construction crews to carry out planned activities for the Killara Station Upgrade. The site is used by our workers to access the railway tracks to carry out work.

During standard construction hours, the access site is also used as a temporary storage area for materials and supplies required by our planned work. It is also used during weekends when trains are not operating, and it is safe to access the rail corridor to conduct construction work. From time to time, the site is also used by maintenance and other rail workers.

We appreciate that sometimes work in the rail corridor may be disruptive. We apologise for any inconvenience caused by this work and thank you for your understanding.

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Construction hours

Standard construction hours are 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm, Saturdays.

Completion of all work is dependent on several factors including weather and site conditions and is subject to change. We will advise you if dates are changed.
